



North Carolina Dental Assistant Requirements

Certification or approved/accredited training is not required for entry-level Dental Assistant jobs. MedCerts graduates set themselves apart in a competitive job market by demonstrating to employers that they hold the knowledge and skills required for job - as proven through graduation and certification.

There are often additional job titles recognized by each state's board of Dentistry, each having requirements different from what is shown below. The most closely associated job title for qualified MedCerts graduates is shown within this document. For simplification and display purposes, the shortest or simplest pathway to eligibility as a MedCerts graduate is shown along with any additional requirements beyond program completion and/or certification.

Immediate Eligibility & Scope of Practice

Is dental assisting certification REQUIRED for entry level? NO

Entry Level North Carolina Dental Assistant Job Title: Dental Assistant (DA I)¹

Will I be eligible for certification after completing my program through MedCerts? YES

 MedCerts' Dental Assistant program has been reviewed and is approved by the American Medical Technologists (AMT) board, which upon completion qualifies the graduate to attempt the Registered Dental Assistant (RDA) Certification Exam.²

Can I take dental X-rays? YES, after completing NC-approved, 7-hour course in clinical dental radiology and a 7-hour course in the production and use of dental x-rays.³

What else can I do as a NC Dental Assistant (DA I)? Each state develops their own State Practice Act which defines the allowable duties by title.⁵

Post-Graduate/In-Field Career Advancement Opportunities

Dental Assistant II in Training (DA II)6

- 3,000 hours & at least 2 years of experience chairside assisting under supervision of NC-licensed dentist
- Complete 3-hour course in dental office emergencies
- Complete 3-hour course in sterilization and infection control
- Current CPR certification
